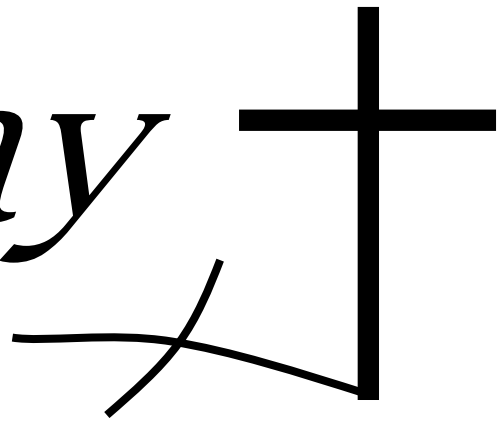

Birth of a baby brings changes for parents as they become responsible for a helpless totally dependent human being and for a while the needs of this small fragile individual have to be put before their own.

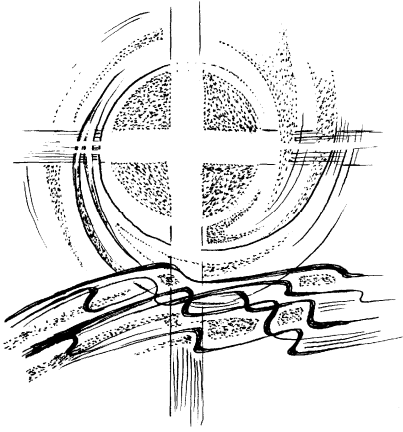

Holy Days in

September

On the 25th September the church remembers Lancelot Andrewes

Bishop of Winchester and Spiritual Writer.

Born in 1555 in Barking, Lancelot Andrewes studied at Merchant Taylors' School and Pembroke Hall (now Pembroke College), Cambridge. After ordination, he held several posts before accepting appointments as Bishop, first of Chichester, then of Ely and finally of Winchester in 1619. Andrewes was present at the Hampton Court Conference in 1604, which furthered the reform of the Church of England, and he was also a translator of much of the Old Testament of what is known as the 'Authorized Version of the Bible'. His preaching and his writings proved highly influential and his holiness of life and gentle nature endeared him to all who met him. He died on this day in the year 1626 and his remains lie in a church which was then in his diocese of Winchester but now is the cathedral for the diocese of Southwark.

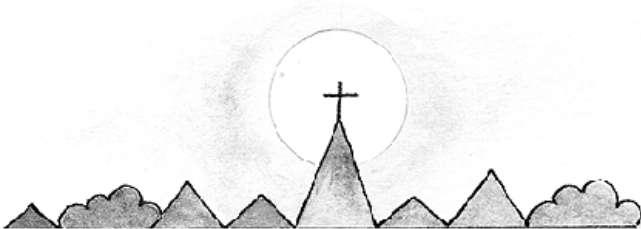
God's Family at Worship

13th Celtic Evening Prayers – a time of Worship inspired by the Iona community

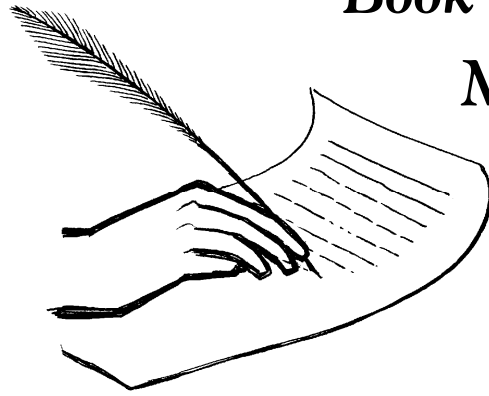

Conversation Matters by Peter Shaw

This book shows how to engage effectively with one another in today's modern e-mail and soundbite culture which is threatening the art of conversation. Without real encounters people lose contact, stop understanding one another and can become isolated.

The author finds inspiration in the example of Jesus whose encounters with people were always decisive. It was as people talked with him that they either embraced his message or moved some distance from it. Jesus engaged through listening, building trust, talking with people directly, and showing discernment through listening to what they said.

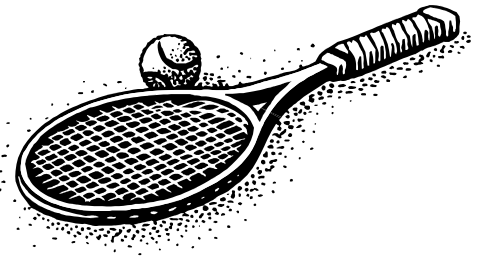

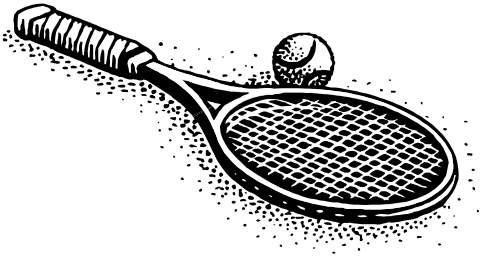


Worplesdon Tennis Club
