The Second Reading: Galatians 1.11-24

Reader: St Alban's: Rachel Waugh St Mary's: Mary Hillard

(Readings from this letter continue independently of the other lessons. Paul is here strongly defending the authentic nature of his conversion. His teaching does not depend on the church developments in Jerusalem.)

I want you to know, brothers and sisters, that the gospel that was proclaimed by me is not of human origin; for I did not receive it from a human source, nor was I taught it,

but I received it through a revelation of Jesus Christ.

You have heard, no doubt, of my earlier life in Judaism.

I was violently persecuting the church of God

and was trying to destroy it.

I advanced in Judaism

beyond many among my people of the same age,

for I was far more zealous for the traditions of my ancestors.

But when God, who had set me apart before I was born

and called me through his grace, was pleased

to reveal his Son to me,

so that I might proclaim him among the Gentiles,

he had compassion for her and said to her,
'Do not weep.'
Then he came forward and touched the bier,
and the bearers stood still.
And he said, 'Young man, I say to you, rise!'
The dead man sat up and began to speak,
and Jesus gave him to his mother.
Fear seized all of them;
and they glorified God, saying,
'A great prophet has risen among us!'
and 'God has looked favourably on his people!'
This word about him spread throughout Judea
and all the surrounding country.

I did not confer with any human being,
nor did I go up to Jerusalem
to those who were already apostles before me,
but I went away at once into Arabia,
and afterwards I returned to Damascus.
Then after three years
I did go up to Jerusalem to visit Cephas

but I did not see any other apostle
except James the Lord's brother.
In what I am writing to you,
before God, I do not lie!
Then I went into the regions of Syria and Cilicia,
and I was still unknown by sight
to the churches of Judea that are in Christ;
they only heard it said,
'The one who formerly was persecuting us
is now proclaiming the faith he once tried to destroy.'
And they glorified God because of me.

The Gospel Reading: Luke 7. 11-17

V. Hear the gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to Luke.

R. Glory to you, O Lord.

(Each Sunday we now read consecutively through Luke's Gospel. Luke has already told us of Jesus's power to heal the sick, and now he reveals greater divine power still. It is an extraordinary moment when Jesus, just like Elijah of old, restores life to the dead son of a widow.)

Jesus went to a town called Nain,
and his disciples and a large crowd went with him.
As he approached the gate of the town,
a man who had died was being carried out.
He was his mother's only son,
and she was a widow;
and with her was a large crowd from the town.
